# Year 3 - Questions to ask your child when reading at home.

#### Retrieval Questions

- Who are the characters in this story?
- When / where is this story set? How do you know?
- Which part of the story best describes the setting?
- What do you think is happening here?
- What might this mean?

## Summarising Questions

- What is the main point in this paragraph?
- Sum up what has happened so far in 20 words or less.
- Which is the most important point in these paragraphs?
- Do any sections / paragraphs deal with the same theme / issue?

### Inference Questions

- What do you think.... Means? Why do you think that?
- Why do you think...?
- How do you think...?
- Can you explain why...?
- What do these words mean and why do you think that the author chose them?

## **Predicting Questions**

- Can you think of another story with a similar theme?
- Which stories have openings like this?
  Do you think that this story will be the same?
- Why did the author choose this setting?
- What do you think might happen to the character next? Why do you think that?

## Vocabulary Questions

- What does this word / phrase / sentence tell you about the character / setting / mood?
- By writing in this way, what effect has the author created?
- What other words / phrases could the author have used here?
- How has the author made you feel by writing...?

#### Author's Choice Questions

- What does the word... tell you about...?
- Find two ways that the author tells you...
- What do you think the author meant by...?
- Which words do you think are the most important? Why?
- Which words do you like the most? Why?
- How has the author made you feel happy / sad / angry / frustrated?

## Compare, Contrast and Comment Questions

- What is similar / different about two of the characters?
- Explain why... did that.
- Describe the different characters' reactions to the same event.
- Is that as good as...?
- Which character / setting / book is better and why?
