# Year 6 – Questions to ask your child when reading at home.

### Retrieval Questions

- Find the... in this text. Is it anywhere else?
- When/where is this story set? Find evidence in the text.
- Find the part of the story that best describes the setting.
- What do you think is happening here? Why?
- Who is telling this story?

### Inference Questions

- What do you think.... means? Why do you think that? Could it be anything else?
- I think....; do you agree? Why / why not?
- Why do you think the author decided to ?
- Can you explain why....?
- What do these words mean and why do you think that the author chose them?

### Vocabulary Questions

- What does this word/phrase/sentence tell you about the character/setting/mood?
- By writing..., what effect has the author created? Do you think they intended to?
- What other words/phrases could the author have used here? Why?
- How has the author made you feel by writing...? Why

# Summarising Questions

- What is the main point in this paragraph? Is it mentioned anywhere else?
- Sum up what has happened so far in 10 words/seconds or less.
- Which is the most important point in these paragraphs? Why?
- Do any sections/paragraphs deal with the same themes?

## Predicting Questions

- What do you think will happen next in the story? What evidence can you find to support what you think?
- Can you think of another story with a similar theme? How do their plots differ?
- Which stories have openings like this?
  Do you think that this story will develop the same way?
- Why did the author choose this setting?
  Will that influence the story?

#### Author's Choice Questions

- What does the word... tell you about...?
- Find two ways that the author tells you...
- What do you think the author meant by...?
- Which words do you think are the most important? Why?
- Which words do you like the most? Why?
- How has the author made you feel happy / sad / angry / frustrated?

### Compare, Contrast and Comment Questions

- What is similar / different about two of the characters?
- Explain why... did that.
- Describe the different characters' reactions to the same event.
- Does this story have a moral?
- Which character / setting / book is better and why?
